## A LITTLE HISTORY

Morgan Jayne Makowecki, 18 yr. old daughter of Fred Makowecki of Drumheller, AB passed away suddenly &



unexpectedly May 4, 2006 of sudden liver failure.

Valerie Nelson had been instrumental in the private adoption of Morgan as an infant, and had kept contact with the Makowecki family

until a few years ago. Upon the passing of Morgan, Fred searched for and found Valerie, now director of Familias Saludables (Healthy Families) on the Island of Roatan in the Honduras. She has made a lifetime commitment in working to help save babies whose mothers are HIV+ or have AIDS. They had never had a name for the project, but, when hearing of Morgan Jayne's passing, knew it was to be named after her. As it is a "grass roots" project running on a very low budget, Valerie return to Canada to visit and fund raise once a year. Rent and power alone total over \$600.00 a month. They receive grants which cover testing kits, ARVs and transportation to the other 4 islands, but little else.. In addition to their own family, they have adopted kids whose mothers have died with aids. Currently they are 3 adults and 5 kids ages 10 yrs to 2 months living in a tiny house.

## THE NEEDS

**Infant Formula: Most critical, powdered, all brands, (out-dated is OK); Infant & Children's Vitamins; Pedialyte or other electrolyte balanced drink; Antibiotic cream, any brand; Infant, children's, adult, Tylenol or other brand fever reducer; Pre-natal vitamins, Cough Medicine, Folic Acid and Adult Multivitamins; Infant or children' antibiotics (liquid or powdered—NOT tablets); Baby clothes, blankets, receiving blankets, underpads, new or good used condition; Disposable Diapers all sizes; Cloth diapers, diaper pins, rubber pants; Baby bottles, nipples, brushes, etc.; Small Infant Toys, stuffed animals or other Baby Items—given to encourage pregnant women to be tested; Little girl's hair bows, elastics, barrettes; Children's small toys, stickers, coloring books, crayons— given to siblings during home visits or at testing clinics; Miscellaneous Medical supplies (dated items OK)—masks, rubber gloves, alcohol wipes, medical tape, cotton balls, gauze; Hotel sized soaps, lotions, perfume samples, etc.—to help women feel better about themselves; Condoms, Latex only, all brands; Printer cartridges Epson C85; Paper (any kinds or color), pens, any office supplies to keep office running; FOOD or money to buy food for clients who cannot get jobs because of the stigma of AIDS.**



## THE PROJECTS

**The Empowering Women Project:** Helps HIV+ women educate others about HIV (funded by the Canadian Government (CIDA), the Muttart Foundation and Change for Children.)

**The Healthy Babies/Sunny Futures Project:** Provides testing for all pregnant women to reduce the transmission rate (funded by Global Fund).

A **Palliative Care Project** that is in the infancy stage.

**The Morgan Jayne Project:** Supplies HIV+ moms with baby formula, clothes, over the counter medications, etc., to further reduce the rate of AIDS transmission.

A **Christmas Program:** Asks Canadian donors to pick a child off the list of kids who are living with AIDS in the program (about 30 kids) and have them send a gift for their chosen child.

They also collect other small toys and distribute them throughout the island in the poorest areas. Last year they saw 1000 kids!
